In cooperation with the Council and the Respiro Verde (Green Breath) Legalberi Cultural Association, which has been working tirelessly for many years to protect trees and their significance for respecting nature, especially in the city, the R Society has involved the City Hall, the Council and the University of La Sapienza in the creation of the kaki Tree. The project has been realized. The university garden is an area open to the public, and for about three years now, the Respiro Verde Legalberi Society has been taking care of the Indian Bodhi tree, which is of great importance to Hinduism, Buddhism and Jainism, and has been performing a 'ritual' called 'Salute to the King of Trees' here. The kaki tree has been planted in the garden of the university's Oriental Languages Department and the Respiro Verde Legalberi Association is working with students to take care of the tree.

The Planting Ceremony at a park in Ficulle was held on 25 April, which is the anniversary of the end of the war in Italy. Children in Kindergarten participated in the ceremony. They made flags with their wishes for peace, and decorated them around the Kaki tree. Children wore orange T-shirts, and made orange flags, and the whole village was covered in Orange.

One of the applicant, Paola (an ceramic artist) created the beautiful "Peace-path", and people in the village were able to make their own "Peace-seeds" with clay for the path.

The "ONLUS GNARI DÈ MOMPIÀ" association and the "BOBO ARCHETTI FONDAZIONE" have joined forces to work on environmental protection and peace education. It is an organization that has. Their activities are based on a large area within the "Parco delle Colline Bresciane" (Brescia Hill Park), where 4.475.332 m² out of a total area of 43.087.838 m² belongs to the area under the jurisdiction of the Brescia City Council. This takes place in the Montpiano Valley. Where the Montpiano Valley begins, there is a former army powder magazine, now owned by the city council. American and British fighter planes bombed this powder magazine on January 31, 1945, killing 22 people, all civilians, most of whom were residents of Mompiano, a northern suburb of Brescia. Today, this former powder magazine is not open to the public. That's because the asbestos used in many of the buildings has to be recovered. After the recovery, the plan is to transform it into a place of peace for the public.

"ONLUS GNARI DÈ MOMPIÀ" and "BOBO ARCHETTI FONDAZIONE" will be built at the end of a path through the valley and will be the "Rifugio A kaki tree was planted



just outside the "nella Valle di Mompiano" (Shelter of the Valley of Mompiano).



"The "ONLUS GNARI DÈ MOMPIÀ" association has been working with Brescia schools from kindergarten to high school since 2002, and over the past 12 years, thousands of children have visited the valley to carry out activities related to the environment, nature, art and peace We have used this shelter as a base for. A tree planting ceremony was held on April 11, in cooperation with the schools that have visited here in the past. The planting site is a vacant plot of land on which the shelter stands, about 300 meters above sea level, in the woods of Mount Madelina, on the grounds of the "Parco delle Colline Bresciane" (Brescia Hill Park). Since June 2014, the two associations have been organizing a project called "Artevale" - how to bring art into nature and project a place of peace", and the shelter has been. The idea is to send a message of peace through wooden artworks installed around the pathway that runs along the side of the powder magazine. The plan is to bring more attention to the kaki tree by making it a more artistic and educational project related to the tree.

The sapling of the bombed Kaki Tree was planted in “Barrak’s Lane Community Garden” in Oxford, UK. Many Local people and their children participated to the ceremony, for 2015 is the seventieth anniversary of the end of World War II. There were also members of the COFEPOW (a charity to perpetuate the memories of the Far East prisoners of war) too.

There were Koto performance, reading of poems and a chorus group sang ‘An Irish Blessing’ on the first half of the ceremony. The later half was the Reiki Blessing (spiritual practice) lead by Ama from Oxford Reiki group. Everyone placed a pebble around the tree with they’re wishes for peace.

The city of San Michele di Gantzalia is located in the interior of the island of Sicily and is scattered on the slopes of the hills. The climate is extremely mild. The school is located at the highest point of the village and is surrounded by a sloping courtyard. The care of the kaki tree is carried out by several teachers who directly supervise the children's work and through classroom activities related to this theme. In addition, local farmers, who are also the children's parents, will use the experience gained from their practice to teach the children how to successfully grow their persimmon trees after planting.
